

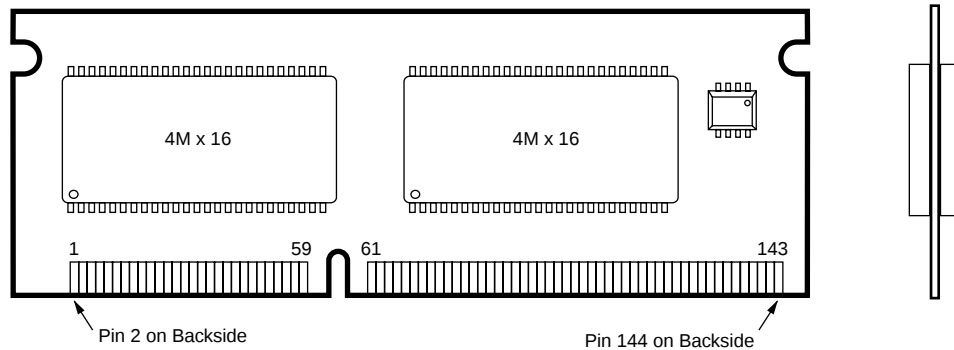

Description

The V43644Y04V(C)TG-75 memory module is organized 4,194,304 x 64 bits in a 144 pin SODIMM. The 4M x 64 memory module uses 4 Mosel-Vitellic 4M x 16 SDRAM. The x64 modules are ideal for use in high performance computer systems where increased memory density and fast access times are required.

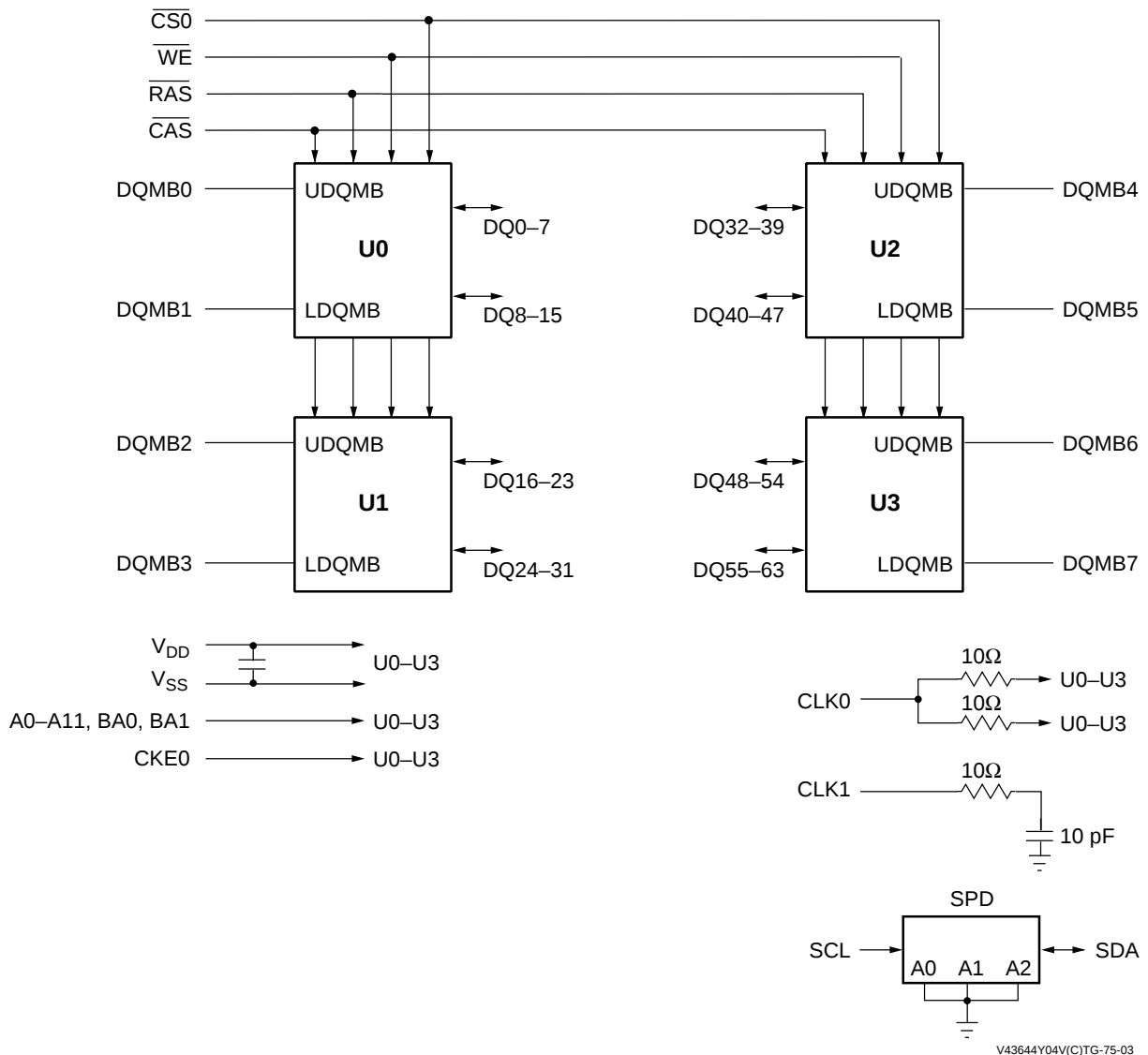

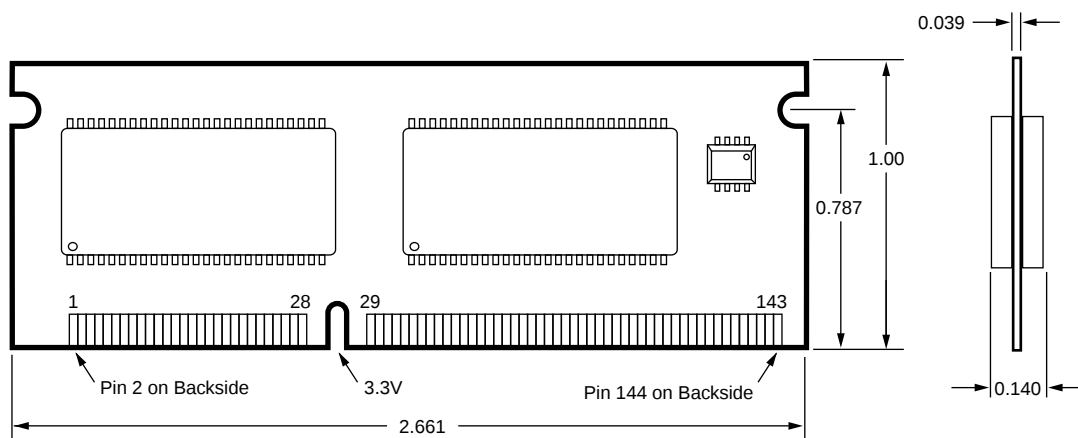
- The specified values are valid when addresses are changed no more than once during $t_{CK}(\text{min.})$ and when No Operation commands are registered on every rising clock edge during $t_{RC}(\text{min.})$. Values are shown per module bank.
- The specified values are valid when data inputs (DQ's) are stable during $t_{RC}(\text{min.})$.
- All AC characteristics are shown for device level.
An initial pause of 100 μs is required after power-up, then a Precharge All Banks command must be given followed by 8 Auto Refresh (CBR) cycles before the Mode Register Set Operation can begin.
- AC timing tests have $V_{IL} = 0.4\text{V}$ and $V_{IH} = 2.4\text{V}$ with the timing referenced to the 1.4V crossover point. The transition time is measured between V_{IH} and V_{IL} . Package Diagram

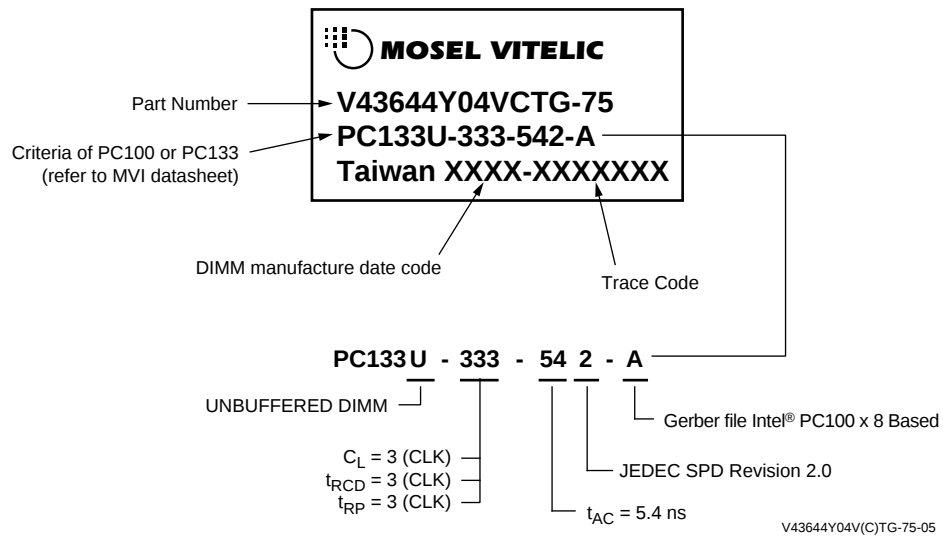
144 Pin SODIMM
