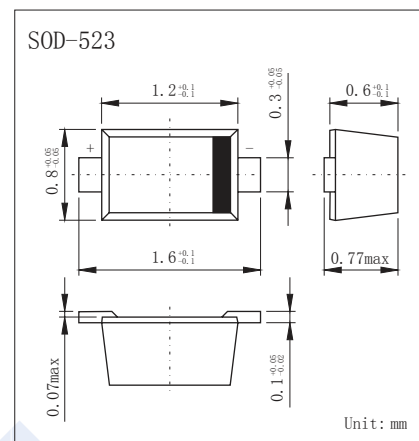
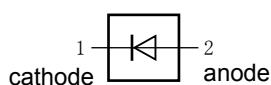


Switching Diodes

BAS521 (KAS521)

■ Features

- High switching speed: $t_{rr} \leq 50 \text{ ns}$
- High reverse voltage: $V_R \leq 300 \text{ V}$
- Repetitive peak forward current: $I_{FRM} \leq 1 \text{ A}$
- High-speed switching
- High-voltage switching

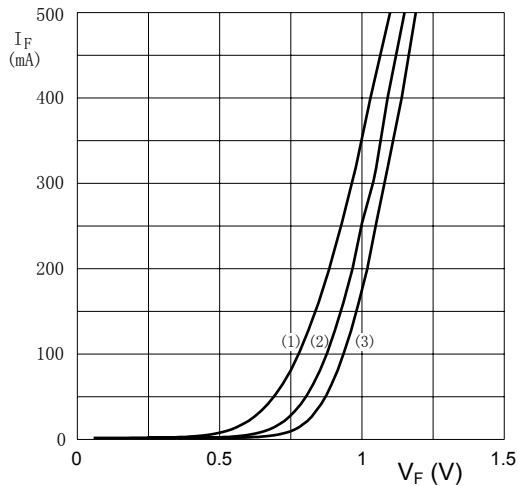

Fig 1. Forward current as a function of forward voltage; typical values

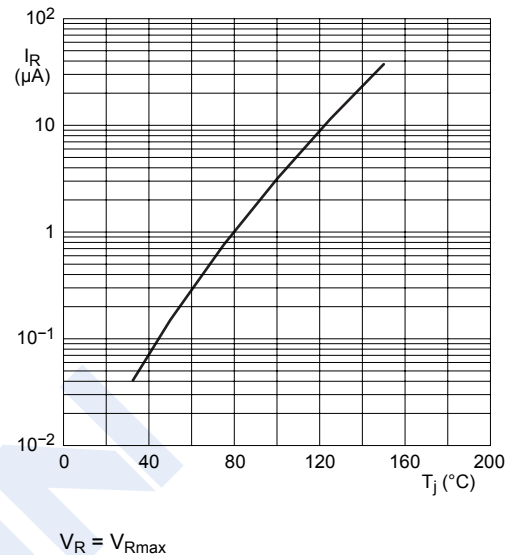


Fig 2. Reverse current as a function of junction temperature; typical values

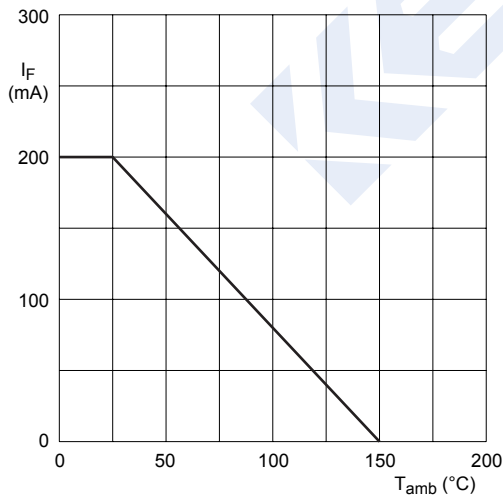


Fig 3. Forward current as a function of ambient temperature; derating curve

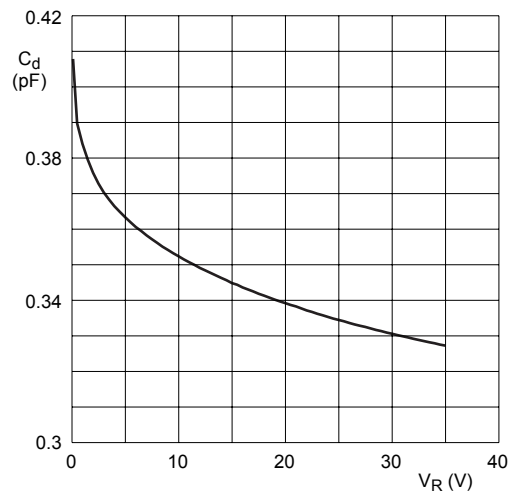
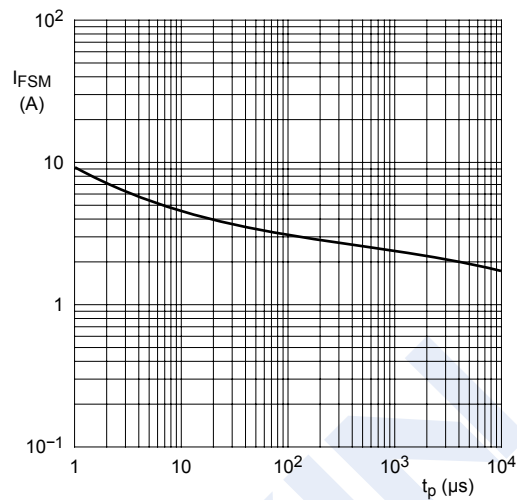


Fig 4. Diode capacitance as a function of reverse voltage; typical values

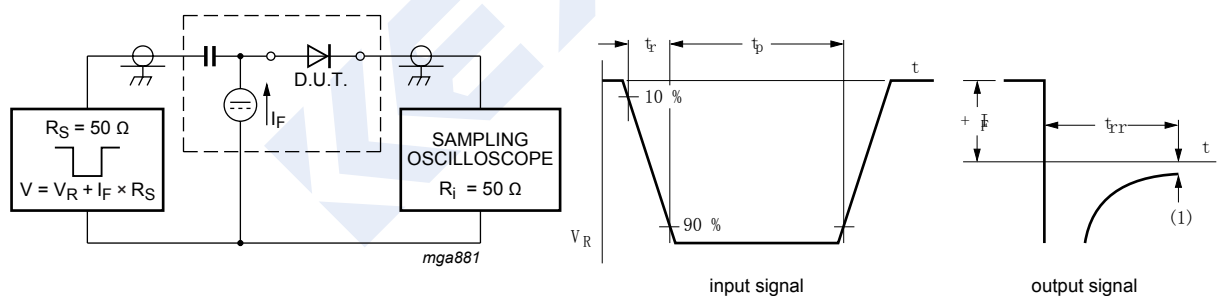
■ Typical Characteristics
