COMPACTRON TWIN PENTODE

DESCRIPTION AND RATING

The 11AR11 is a compactron containing two remote-cutoff pentodes. It is designed primarily for intermediate-frequency amplifier service in television receivers. Except for heater characteristics and ratings, the 11AR11 is identical to the 6AR11.

NOTES

- * Heater voltage for a bogey tube at $I_f = 0.45$ amperes.
- † The equipment designer should design the equipment so that heater current is centered at the specified bogey value, with heater supply variations restricted to maintain heater current within the specified tolerance.
- § The time required for the voltage across the heater to reach 80 percent of the bogey value after applying 4 times the bogey heater voltage to a circuit consisting of the tube heater in series with a resistance equal to 3 times the bogey heater voltage divided by the bogey heater current.

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
