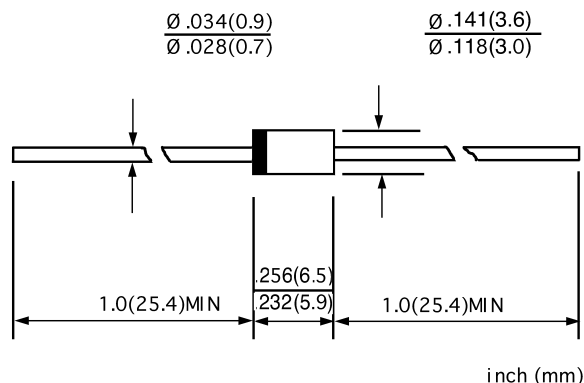

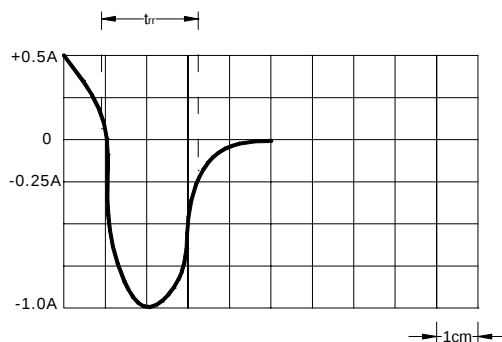
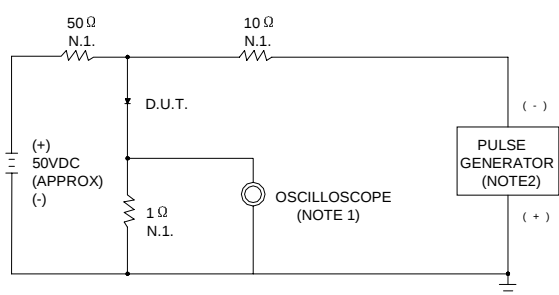

FIG.2 – TYPICAL FORWARD CHARACTERISTIC

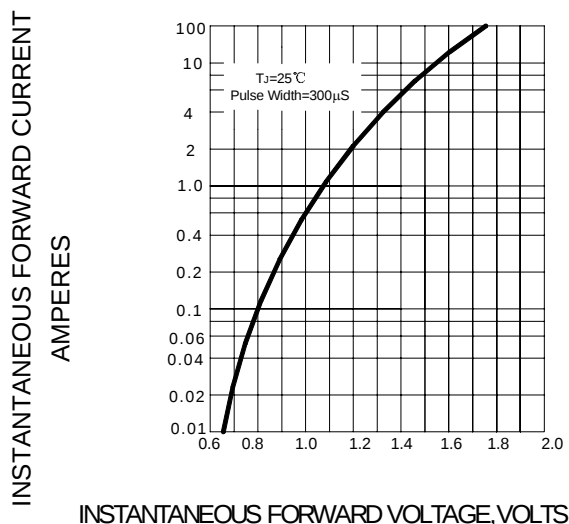


FIG.3 – FORWARD DERATING CURVE

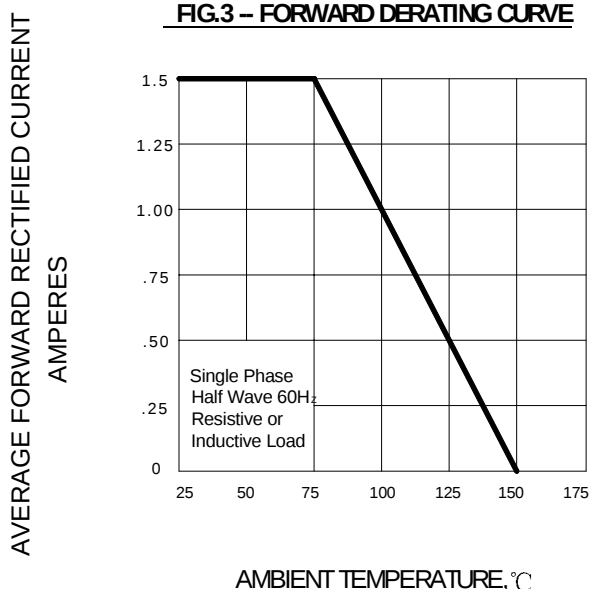


FIG.5-PEAK FORWARD SURGE CURRENT

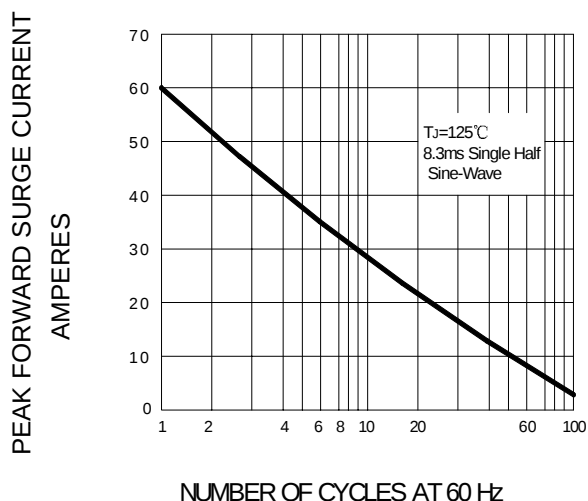


FIG.6-TYPICAL JUNCTION CAPACITANCE
