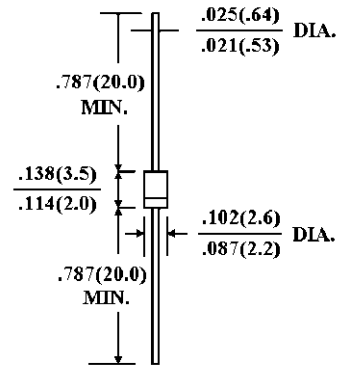

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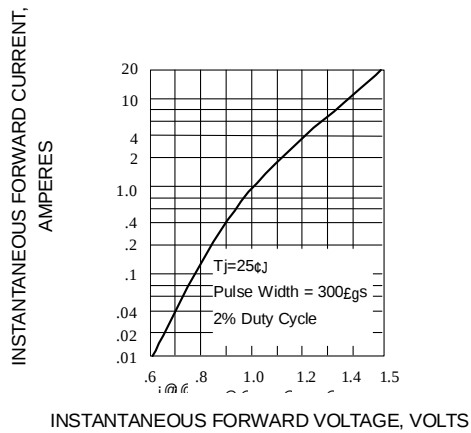


Fig. 1-TYPICAL FORWARD CHARACTERISTICS

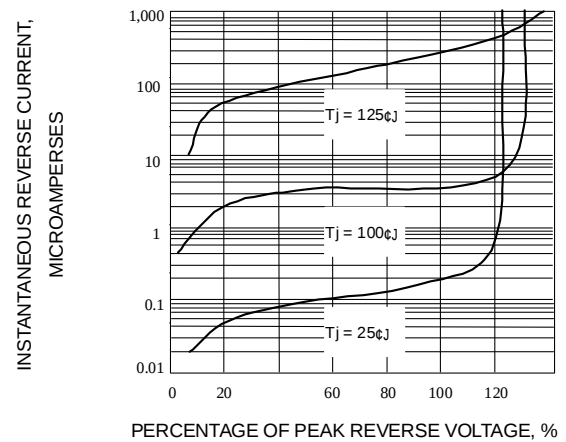


Fig. 2-TYPICAL REVERSE CHARACTERISTICS

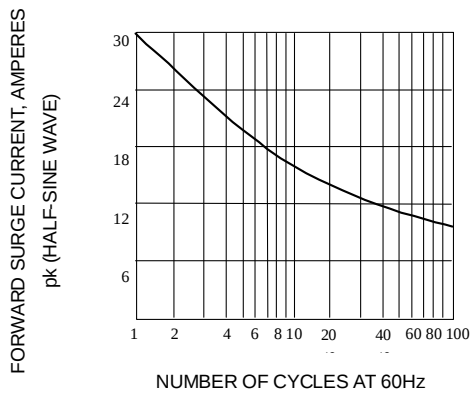


Fig. 3-MAXIMUM OVERLOAD SURGE-CURRENT

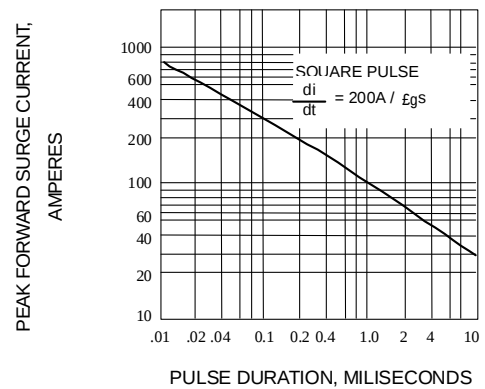


Fig. 4-PEAK FORWARD SURGE CURRENT

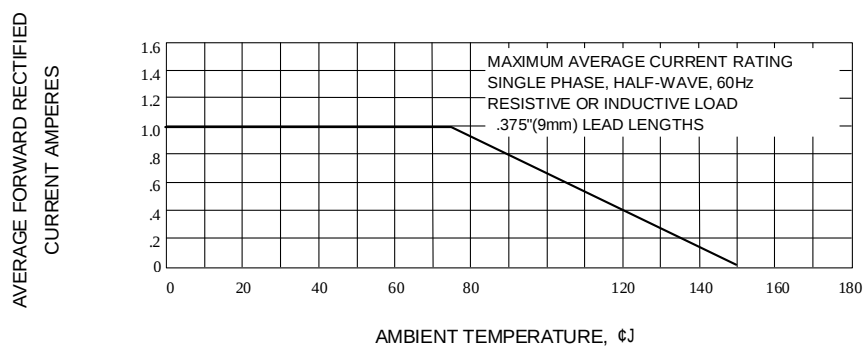


Fig. 5-FORWARD DERATING CURVE
